





Orphans and vulnerable children in Chilomoni are safer and achieving more due to the support received from their international sponsors. At least a third of all day care places at Mother Teresa are reserved for the most vulnerable, whose families would never afford the opportunity without sponsorship. But with so many children needing help, how to choose who gets a free place? As always, it's best to ask those who live and work in the heart of the community. Every quarter, the local allocations committee which is mainly local parents and community workers meet up. 15 local representatives attended our latest meeting and voted on which children in the community need the most support. They will all be offered a free sponsored place in the nursery. In the April meeting 10 places were allocated, although only 5 places are currently available. We are seeking new sponsors so that we fully meet immediate need.

Recent workshops include, health and hygiene, using local resources for play, communication and Outdoor play. Patricio has also worked with our Practice manager to create 30 book bags (each containing 15 books) for nurseries borrow and to swap!

Extended Schools started their Conservation Club – supported by the Wildlife & Environment Society of Malawi (WESM). Primary school children from 3 local schools planted 300 saplings to prevent ongoing soil erosion problems in Chilomoni – well done all diggers!
